THE UNIVERSITY

The Aga Khan University is a pioneering institution of higher education and research that works to improve quality of life in the developing world and beyond. We educate leaders, generate life-saving knowledge, and set an example that raises standards in the societies in which we work. We empower women and the disadvantaged, strengthen pluralism and partner with world-renowned institutions to address problems that affect millions of people.

A not-for-profit institution, AKU was founded in 1983 by His Highness the Aga Khan. As Pakistan's first private university, we paved the way for the growth of the country's private higher education sector. In the early 2000s, the University expanded to Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Afghanistan, and the United Kingdom.

At AKU, students flourish in a supportive environment that embraces diversity, demands excellence, and encourages leadership and direct engagement with real-world challenges. Our graduates go on to study and work at eminent universities and organizations around the world, and to make a difference in their home countries.

AKU is open to all, regardless of race, religion, gender, or geographic origin. Two-thirds of students and half of faculty members are women. Admission is based on merit, and our merit-based tuition waiver and needs sensitive financial assistance programme ensures that individuals from all income backgrounds are able to attend.

We do not discriminate on faith, gender, or national origin. Our selection process is rigorous which varies by academic programmes, but a common criterion includes fluency in English.

PHD PROGRAMME

A PhD programme is the backbone of meaningful and scholarly engagements in any university. It is also crucial for the development of new generations of researchers, teachers, and leaders. The PhD programme in the Faculty of Health Sciences (FHS) at AKU is central to its mission of producing research-based knowledge that is relevant to the developing world, and which will have impact. With this aim in view, a graduate programme in Health Sciences was implemented at AKU in October 1999.

The University's PhD Programme in Health Sciences is accredited by the Higher Education Commission (HEC) in Pakistan.

The PhD programme is an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary programme in health sciences with four specialities/streams.

- Biological Sciences
- Clinical Sciences
- Nursing
- Population and Public Health

A brief description of these streams has been provided.

- **Biological Sciences:**
Research training within this discipline will include studies in the fields of Anatomy, Biochemistry, Cell Biology, Immunology, Microbiology, Genomics, Pathology, Pharmacology and Physiology. Candidates will be expected to undertake a novel doctoral thesis project in one of the above-mentioned fields.
- **Clinical Sciences:**
Clinical research involves interactions with patients, diagnostic clinical materials or data, or populations in the following areas: (1) disease mechanisms (etiopathogenesis); (2) clinical knowledge, detection, diagnosis, and natural history of disease; (3) therapeutic interventions including clinical trials of drugs, devices and instruments; (4) translational research; (5) behavioural research. This may also include health services research, including outcomes, and cost-effectiveness. Doctoral-level training in clinical sciences will strengthen candidate knowledge in a specific clinically important area with applications of research methodologies for conducting diverse clinical research.
- **Nursing:**
The focus of this stream is to provide candidates with a rigorous training in research that is offered through coursework and mentorship with the aim of developing clinical scholars and faculty members capable of scientific inquiry for innovative practice and knowledge development for human health caring. Candidates will be required to produce an original piece of research that is important for human health from the perspective of nursing.
- **Population and Public Health:**
The programme is designed for a wide variety of candidates, such as epidemiologists and biostatisticians, social and behavioural scientists, environmental scientists, health professionals and health administrators with an interest in population health. The principles of epidemiology, biostatistics, social and behavioural sciences, environmental health and health policy and management will form the core of this discipline. Through course work, students would acquire a broad knowledge of population and public health; they would be required to pursue an in-depth study in an area of specialization within the population health framework.

In each PhD application cycle, projects will be available within each of the above-mentioned streams. These will vary depending on the opportunities for research at the time of admission. Students are advised to check details of available projects and other instructions on the AKU website www.aku.edu/admissions/phd-hs at the time of applying to the programme.

Nursing stream applicants: You may suggest your own research topic and identify a potential supervisor from the list available on the website www.aku.edu/admissions/phd-hs, ensuring that their area of expertise aligns with your proposed research topic. You must interact with the supervisor before writing a research intent to check the Supervisor's availability and interest.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE AND DESIGN

The PhD is based on a total of 18 credits of coursework to be covered in the initial phase of the programme and followed by a period of three to four years assigned for original research. Upon completion of the coursework, confirmation for PhD candidacy will be based on passing the comprehensive examination and successful defence of the research proposal (Synopsis defense).

The timelines and other details of the PhD programme for full-time students will be as follows:

Year 1 - 2

- Compulsory eight credit hours for Core Courses.
- Six credit hours for Stream-specific courses and four credit hours for Electives.
- Course work of 18 credit hours preferably to be completed within 18 months and followed by a comprehensive examination (written and oral)/Resit examination and Synopsis defense for granting candidacy as a PhD researcher.
- Thesis synopsis approval leads to progression of full PhD candidacy.

Year 3 - 4

- Completion of Research Work and Thesis, as per AKU policy.

Coursework

The coursework will comprise of:

- i) Compulsory Core Courses:* These will be essential for all students. These includes but are not limited to are Scientific writing, Biostatistics in Health Care and Ethics in Healthcare Research.
- ii) Stream-specific Courses:* These courses are essential for all students in the particular discipline and constitute six credits hours.
- iii) Elective courses:* Different elective courses will be available to students from which they can choose the ones related to their interest/specialty and constitute ten credit hours.

Research Work

The student will be expected to work towards his/her research Thesis in parallel with coursework. At the time of admission, the student will select a Principal Thesis Supervisor.

ADMISSION INFORMATION

APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Candidates must have 18 years of education including a MS/MPhil or equivalent degree in relevant field based on a minimum of 30 credits after 16-years of education.

A minimum CGPA 3.0 (out of 4.0 in the Semester System) or First Division – 60% (in the Annual System) in MS / MPhil / FCPS / FRCP / equivalent degree is required.

The University may request for additional documents to better understand and evaluate applicant's eligibility as per the University and regulatory body requirements.

ADMISSION TEST

NOTE: *The test will be conducted onsite on computer provided at the test center.*

Candidates are required to write the AKU Admission Test.

The Test comprises of three components:

- i. English Language: This tests language competency. It serves as a qualifier. The score for which will be determined by the University and may change each year.
- ii. Quantitative Reasoning: this assesses the applicants Arithmetic, Information Handling (including interpretation of graphs & tables) and Logical Reasoning (including application of algebra/geometry) skills.
- iii. Subject Specific component: this broadly assesses applicants' knowledge for the PhD Stream they are applying to.

A minimum of 50% passing score is required in Quantitative Reasoning and Subject Specific component separately and a cumulative score of 60% is required to proceed further in the admission process.

The University does not provide any special preparation for the Admission Test, nor does it authorise any publication or preparatory classes for this purpose.

IDENTIFICATION OF SUPERVISOR AND THE RESEARCH PROJECT

Selection Process

- i) Applicants will be required to submit a statement of purpose/research intent that is an integral part of the application. Each PhD applicant must identify a potential research project and a PhD supervisor from the **list of research projects** available on the AKU website www.aku.edu/admissions/phd-hs depending on their research interests. Prior to submission of PhD application

applicants **must** learn about the relevant projects prior to completing their application forms. Each candidate is required to submit a statement of purpose/research intent (500 – 700 words) which describes the reasons for the interest in the project and how the project meets with his/her career objectives. This is an integral part of the application.

- ii) The Admissions Committee shall use the information provided to ascertain the preparedness and interest of the applicant in pursuing doctoral studies. It will review applications and shortlist candidates based on Admission test scores, prior research experience, skills of the applicant must align with the scope and objectives of the research project applied for and must choose based on the availability of PhD Supervisors.
- iii) Applicants selected for interviews will be asked to present their proposed PhD research to a panel of assessors who will be able to make a recommendation for admission of the applicant.
- iv) Admission is finalized after the candidate satisfies all requirements of the Programme including fees/fee-waiver if applicable, full commitment to the programme and feasibility of their proposed PhD study.

PROGRAMME TIMELINES

The PhD in Health Sciences is offered as a full-time degree.

All PhD students must be enrolled continuously until the defense of their thesis, unless approval of temporary withdrawal (leave) has been obtained from the FHS-PhD Committee.

All applications from candidates holding employment need to be supported (in writing) by their Departmental Chair/Head at the time of application. Candidates who are taking long leave to undertake the PhD must provide support letters from their home institutions before their acceptance to the programme may be finalized.

SCHEDULE OF SEMESTERS

The programme will have two regular Semesters, each comprising of 17 weeks and an 8-week summer semester.

ADMISSION PROCESS SUMMARY

Candidates are evaluated in stages:

Stage I	Online submission of application. Applications are reviewed and only eligible candidates are invited to write an AKU PhD Admission Test.
Stage II	Candidates will be shortlisted based on the Admission Test as per the shortlisting criteria. Shortlisted candidates will be asked to connect with potential PhD Supervisors and develop a research plan in their chosen area of interest, based on the current availability of PhD projects as per availability.

	In order to be shortlisted, candidates must have available all required documents and reference letters.
Stage III	Candidates who successfully match with potential PhD Supervisors will be interviewed regarding their selected research project.
Stage IV	Final selection is based on an overall assessment of each candidate's dossier which is formally approved by the University's Admission Review Committee.

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

Applications for admission will be accepted between **November 23, 2025 – February 10, 2026**. Candidates must apply online by logging on to www.aku.edu/apply-online

Applications must be submitted via online process. Applications will only be accepted if a candidate completes the following:

1. Submit the application form online. (*Candidate will receive a copy of the application form on their registered email as confirmation when the application is submitted successfully*)

In the application form, please upload the following:

- i. Upload the application fee on the online form.
 - ii. Upload the CNIC/NICOP both sides as one combined single pdf file or relevant Passport pages (for foreign nationals)
 - iii. Upload the Passport size coloured photograph with a plain white background; taken within the last one week to reflect your current appearance (*see photograph specification section*)
2. As a mandatory requirement:
 - a. Upload attested SSC / O Levels marksheet or equivalent qualification; Equivalence from IBCC, in case of foreign qualification.
 - b. Upload attested HSSC / A levels marksheet or equivalent qualification; Equivalence from IBCC, in case of foreign qualification.
 - c. HEC attested educational documents:
 - Undergraduate Degree & Transcript: Upload both sides of the degree certificate combined as a single pdf file. Upload all sides of the transcripts in sequential order, combined into a single pdf file.
 - Graduate Degree/s and Transcript/s: Upload all sides of the degree certificate combined as a single pdf file. Upload all sides of the transcripts in sequential order, combined into a single pdf file.
 - For unattested documents, upload HEC receipt as evidence.
 - d. 18-years of HEC equivalence, if applying with PostRN BScN degree or foreign degree.
 - e. Curriculum Vitae with list of publications (if any)
 - f. Write “Research Intent” as per the instructions given on page 8.

Note: The photograph should be in JPEG format with 2 MB size, and all other documents should be in PDF format with 5 MB file each.

The application fee is non-refundable. Candidates must ensure eligibility before applying.

Incomplete applications or submission of applications after the deadline are not accepted.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR RESEARCH INTENT

Please identify a potential research project of interest to you from the list of available projects on the AKU website www.aku.edu/admissions/phd-hs. Before the research intent, include the project title and the name of the primary supervisor.

Your statement of intent has a direct impact on the overall strength of your application to study for a research degree. The following advice may help you to improve the quality of your statement of intent. This is an integral part of the application.

- Clearly articulate your current understanding of the field and your ideas for a potential area of research that you would like to study.
- Conduct some initial research about the field or discipline you would like to study.
- Think about the impact you would like to achieve by researching in this area.
- Why do you want to do it? Who might benefit from your work? Why is it important?
- Demonstrate your passion and enthusiasm for the area of research!

Your statement of intent may vary in length and detail, but it is expected to be approximately 500 - 700 words. We will use your statement of intent to assess your broad understanding of your area of research interest.

REFERENCE LETTERS

Three letters of recommendations /references: Referees should be individuals who are well-acquainted with your previous academic work and professional experience. Two letters of reference must be from individuals who are at **arm's length***. Please download reference form from www.aku.edu/admissions/phd-hs These letters should be emailed directly by your referee to postgrad.query@aku.edu. The letters need to be from i) an academic referee from an institute where the individual has trained recently, ii) from a referee who is familiar with the work capacity of the candidate. should be current or not more than one-year-old.

***Arm's length:**

- **No direct supervision:** They haven't been your thesis advisor, supervisor, or mentor.
- **No collaboration:** They haven't co-authored papers or worked on joint research projects with you.
- **No personal ties:** They aren't family, close friends, or romantic partners.

NOTE FOR ALL CANDIDATES

Candidates are requested to ensure they meet application eligibility requirements before applying. These are listed in the programme brochure. Moreover, candidates are responsible to complete the application and other requirements according to the published instructions and time schedule.

Aga Khan University reserves the right to admission; to revoke admission and registration if an application is discovered to be inaccurate or incomplete, or if supporting documents are discovered to be fraudulent. Any candidate who presents a fraudulent document in support of an application for admission may be identified to other universities and colleges.

Candidates may apply for multiple programmes simultaneously. Candidates who are shortlisted for interviews in multiple programmes will be required to provide their order of preference. This information will remain confidential with the Admission Office, and the candidates must attend interviews for all shortlisted programmes. If the candidate is accepted in more than one programme, the preference order provided by the Candidate will be considered by the University, the University reserves the right in its absolute discretion to offer the programme, which it determines to be the most suitable for the Candidate and the decision made by the University will be final.

ADMIT CARD

The admit card to allow you to write the test will be received by candidates who apply online on their portal and/or through an email.

In cases where the admit card is not received 12 working days before the date of the test; candidates must email the Admission Office at postgrad.query@aku.edu for the required information and application details.

If a candidate would like to write the test at a different test centre from the one originally noted in the application form, candidate must inform the admission office via email at least 72 hours before the test so that information can be sent to the Test Centre. Walk in candidates are not encouraged.

Please Note: The University does not take responsibility to conduct the test for candidates who walk into a Test Centre without information.

Please note: To be allowed into the Test Centre to write the Test, candidates must bring:

- A hard copy of the admit card issued by AKU AND

- A valid current photo ID card/original CNIC/college ID card/enrolment card for identification And

Without these documents, AKU reserves the right not to allow you to write the Test.

SHORT-LISTING AND INTERVIEWS

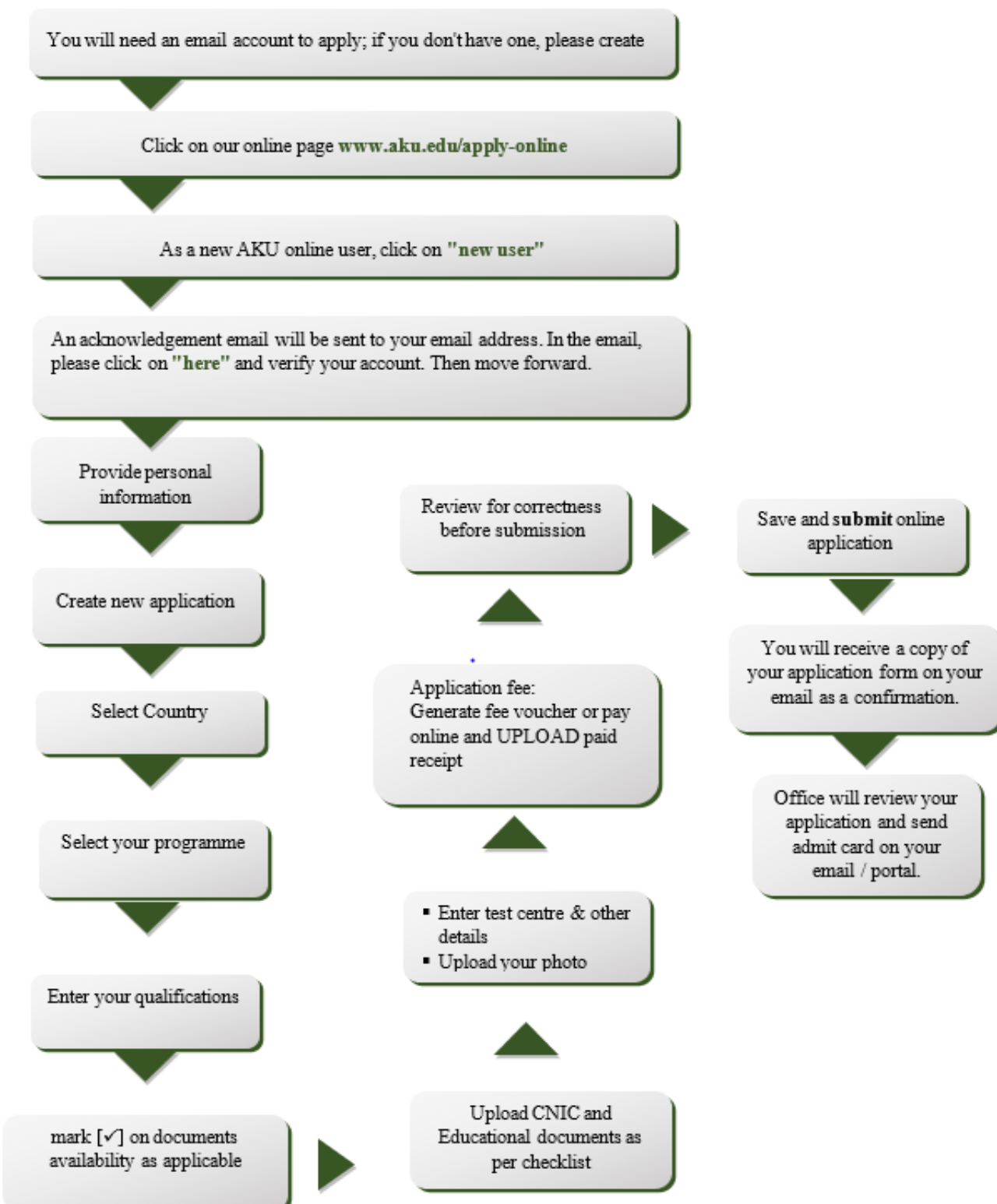
Candidates will be shortlisted based on the Admission Test as per the shortlisting criteria as well as suitable matching with potential PhD Supervisors. As there may be a limited number of projects available, selection of candidates will be on a competitive basis, and the Supervisor may select the most qualified applicant as required.

Interviews will be conducted for those shortlisted candidates whose applications are complete in terms of all the required documents and the reference letters. In addition to presenting the research intent, the purpose of the interview is to assess a variety of attributes, including integrity, motivation and interest in the programme, maturity, social and cultural awareness, knowledge of public health issues in developing nations and evidence of initiative and commitment to the programme.

Interviews are conducted in Karachi. For all candidates who reside outstation, overseas, interviews are conducted over Zoom.

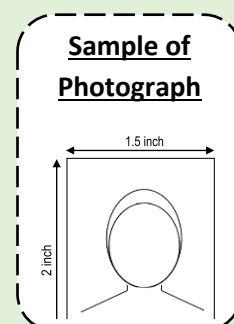

Your photograph is a vital part of your application. Please follow these instructions carefully.

- Passport size coloured photograph with a plain background; taken within the last 1 week to reflect your current appearance.
- File size and format: 2 MB and JPEG format.
- The photo should show a clear front view, full face of the person.

If your photograph does not reflect your current appearance, the University will not allow you to write the Admission Test.



CURRICULUM VITAE (CV) SPECIFICATION

Your CV must include the following:

- qualifications with cGPA/grades/percentage and dates of attendance (admission date & completion date)
- other Continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses (if any)
- list of publications (if any)
- other additional information to support your application

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Admissions to all the academic programmes at Aga Khan University are based on merit and are needs blind, i.e. without considering the financial background of the student.

AKU charges fees for all of its programmes. For financial information including student's fee-paying status and fee structure, please visit: www.aku.edu/admissions/fees-and-funding.

The Aga Khan University will provide full sponsorship based on ACADEMIC MERIT to students admitted to each of the PhD programme streams. This would include tuition fee waiver and a monthly stipend. Tuition waiver consists of full tuition fees in addition to monthly stipend for the four-year period. These can be applied for upon meeting the PhD admission shortlist. *Accommodation costs are not provided as part of tuition support.*

Students who are sponsored or supported by an employer or other Institution will be required to pay the tuition and find monthly stipend support.

All students will be required to pay the other costs of education as provided in the fee schedule.

All students will receive start up research funds for their PhD studies. Details are available with the respective Stream Directors.

STUDENTS ON SPONSORSHIP FROM EXTERNAL AGENCIES

Students expecting to receive sponsorships or scholarships from external agencies to complete the programme are requested to submit the relevant documents and approval letter from the relevant external agency when accepting the offer of admission.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation for outstation students is arranged in the hostels managed by the University. These are shared, non-air-conditioned, furnished accommodation. Hostel space is restricted to students from outside Karachi only.

All students living in the university hostels are expected to conform to rules and regulations. Residence is conditional upon proper use and care of the property, considerate behaviour and periodic reappraisal of the student's need for such accommodation.

CONTESTED DECISIONS

In all matters pertaining to the selection of students, fees, grants, evaluation of scholastic performance, discipline and student affairs, the decision of the University shall be final. Appeals in matters of student selection will be considered within 15 days of the announcement of the new class only if the appeal cites circumstances suggesting that the University has violated provisions of its Charter or that there has been failure to comply with the admissions procedure as described in this document.
