1	Learn the traditional art of Calligraphy	Mr Muhammad Aamir Asghar is a Pakistani artist with over 30 years of experience in sculpture, calligraphy, painting, and blacksmithing. He holds a Diploma in Fine Arts from Sindh Board of Technical Education with a major in Sculpture and a minor in Painting. ince 2008, he has been a cooperative teacher in the Visual Studies Department at the University of Karachi, where he teaches several courses including Material and Processes, 3D Design, 3D Design for Textile Designing (2nd Semester), Calligraphy Typography in Graphic Design, and Material and Process for Islamic Arts.
