IGHD'S INTEGRAL ROLE IN SHAPING WHO GUIDELINES FOR INFANT AND YOUNG CHILD FEEDING

The Institute for Global Health and Development (IGHD) played a pivotal role in two systematic reviews for the most recent 'WHO Guideline for complementary feeding of infants and young children aged 6-23 months'. These reviews evaluated the impact of animal milk compared to infant formula for non-breastfed/mixed-fed infants aged 6-11 months and established the best timing for introducing complementary feeding. IGHD's contributions significantly enhanced the guideline, which provides evidence-based recommendations to healthcare providers, policymakers, and program managers involved in infant and young child feeding programs, all with the goal of promoting optimal growth and development while preventing malnutrition.

IGHD CONTRIBUTES TO CLIMATE & HEALTH INITIATIVES AT WELLCOME TRUST WORKSHOP

Dr. Zulfigar Bhutta, Director of the Institute for Global Health and Development (IGHD) represented IGHD at a recent Wellcome Trust workshop in Mombasa held from September 11th to September 12th, 2023. This workshop, part of the Wellcome Climate & Health strategy, focused on understanding the impact of climate change on human health and developing interventions. It included project leaders from low- and middle-income countries funded by Wellcome to address heat-related health risks. The workshop identified key support needs, including crosslearning, networking, and advocacy, highlighting IGHD's commitment to climate and health at the global level. The program theory of change will be further developed, with enthusiastic project teams eager to implement new ideas in their work, emphasizing the importance of continued collaboration in this critical field.





IGHD ROLLS OUT EZAFFAW PHASE II: ELEVATING HEALTH WITH FORTIFIED FLATBREADS

Building on the success of Phase I, IGHD is now advancing the EZAFFAW trial into its second phase. This phase is centred on elevating health through the consumption of fortified flatbreads. Our focus is to investigate the effectiveness of whole wheat flatbreads made from 'high zinc wheat' and 'post-harvest zinc-fortified wheat flour' in addressing zinc deficiency and improving metabolic health in high-risk populations, including adolescents and adult women at risk of type 2 diabetes. This research holds the promise of delivering practical dietary solutions for better health and will continue to uphold the highest scientific standards.

IGNITING SCIENTIFIC EXCELLENCE: IGHD AND WOMEN IN SCIENCE

At the Institute for Global Health and Development (IGHD), we are dedicated to propelling women in science to new heights. Our Supporting Women in Science program (WIS) is making waves with a dynamic three-phased approach. In a recent milestone, on October 28th. 2023, 79 candidates from seven countries gathered to sit for an online, synchronous exam as part of the Phase I evaluation for Cohort 2. This achievement not only underscores our commitment to empowering women scientists but also reflects the global reach and determination of our aspiring researchers. FIRST TWO CLIMATE CHANGE, ENVIRONMENT AND HEALTH IN POLYCRISES WORKSHOPS: A GLIMPSE INTO TRANSFORMATIVE CONVERSATIONS

The Institute for Global Health & Development (IGHD) at The Aga Khan University, in partnership with Aga Khan Development Network (AKDN) collaborators, embarked on a transformative journey with its "In-Depth Learning Workshops on Climate Change, Environment, and Health in Polycrises." The first two workshops, held in Dubai and Nairobi, marked the beginning of a series of transformative engagements under the Polycrises banner.

FIRST WORKSHOP ON "CLIMATE CHANGE AND ENVIRONMENT AND HEALTH"

DUBAI, JULY 2023

In Dubai, from July 26 to July 28, 2023, the inaugural workshop convened experts from around the world, AKU faculty specializing in Climate, Health, and Environment, and partners from the Aga Khan Health Services. This gathering examined the far-reaching implications of climate change, including air pollution and extreme weather events, notably the impact of rising temperatures on human health.



The discussions delved into strategies for mitigating these effects. Notably, this workshop fostered knowledge exchange, shared best practices, and cultivated professional networks, aiming to guide AKU and AKDN's commitment to prioritized strategies for adapting to and mitigating climate change at the population level. Additionally, it addressed the crucial role of policy and governance at local and national levels.







SECOND WORKSHOP ON "CLIMATE CHANGE, AGRICULTURE, FOOD SECURITY, AND NUTRITION: BRAINSTORMING FOR RESEARCH & ACTION"

NAIROBI, AUGUST 2023

The second workshop, held in Nairobi on August 16-17, 2023, was a collaborative effort with relevant AKDN agencies and global experts from FAO, focusing on Climate and Agriculture. The workshop revolved around the intricate relationship between climate change, agriculture, food security, and nutrition, emphasizing regions served by AKU and AKDN.

It examined the profound effects of climate change, such as extreme heat, shifting seasonality, water availability, and soil fertility, and their repercussions on human health, nutrition, and development pathways. Conversations also encompassed biotechnology, global value chains, and sustainable agriculture strategies targeting vulnerable populations. The need for resilient food systems was a central theme, promoting discussions on interventions to bolster food security and innovative research to enhance nutrition outcomes, particularly in protracted crises.



IGHD EMPOWERS HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS WITH COCHRANE REVIEW WORKSHOP ISLAMABAD, SEPTEMBER 2023

A team of five IGHD researchers and support staff, including Dr. Jai Das, Dr. Nadeem Zuberi, Dr. Ayesha Arshad Ali, Dr. Rahima Yasin, and Mr. Akber Ali, recently conducted a three-day workshop on Cochrane reviews and evidence synthesis from October 5th to 7th, 2023. The workshop was held at Combined Military Hospital, Rawalpindi, and was attended by a group of mid-career healthcare professionals from various medical fields. The event featured interactive teaching sessions, group activities, and presentations, providing valuable insights and knowledge exchange.
