We therefore retain the editorial right to reject papers we do not consider to be of sufficiently high standard. Submitted papers therefore undergo 'light-touch' review and are then endorsed for publication by our Series Editors, Walid Ghali, Jeff Tan and Sarah Bowen Savant.

AKU-ISMC Occasional Papers are published on AKU-ISMC's website, free of charge. Each issue is also archived in the AKU-ISMC eCommons repository as an open access publication.
