Healthcare Delivery Optimization

- ✓ Implement 56/62 EPHS interventions district-wide across all levels of care.
- ✓ Boost health coverage by 50% (UHC index Service Coverage Index : 40 → 60/100 across the district’s three Talukas)
- ✓ Upgrade PHC quality through training & supervision
- ✓ Fully deploy digital systems (EMR/DHIS2) for reliable and efficient decision making
- ✓ Scale EPHS across Sindh through comprehensive roadmap and toolkits

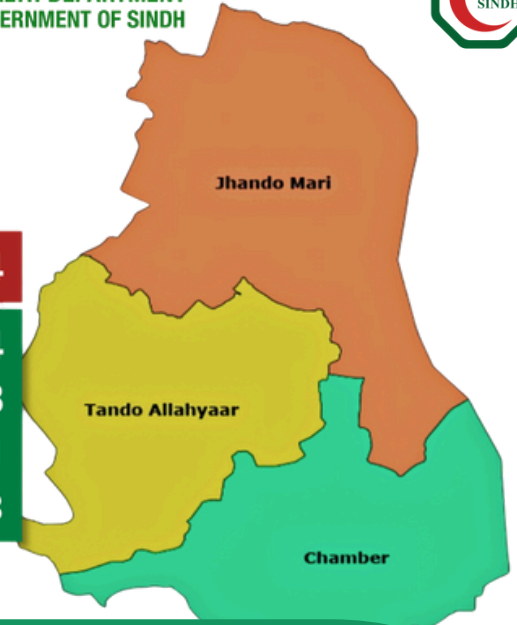

Transforming Health in Rural Sindh

Implementation of Essential Package of Health Services (EPHS) Pilot in District Tando Allahyar

Bridging the gap in availability of quality essential services in Tando Allah Yar.

- 62 essential health services, from emergency care to maternal health, are now being delivered across three levels of care: community, primary health centers and first level hospitals
- Clinical guidelines have been created and adapted for real use, training staff to provide consistent, evidence-based care.
- Digital health systems, including DHIS2 and phased roll-out of Electronic Medical Records, are being introduced to improve decision-making and data quality.
- Communities and providers are working together to shape services that support local needs



Tando Allahyar, home to nearly one million people - with 78% in rural areas - is implementing the Essential Package of Health Services (EPHS) to expand access to quality health care for all.

This serves as a model for government leadership, strong partnerships, and community efforts coming together for health reform.
