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
INTRODUCTION

- Total population (2023) = 241.49 million (24 crore)
- Annual number of births in Pakistan (2020) = 6.046 million
- Annual number of deaths in Pakistan (2021) = 2,51,000
- NMR of Pakistan 39/1000 LB (2021)
- 70% conducted by skilled birth attendants (2020)
- 66% conducted in institutions (2020)
- Access to skilled birth attendant in urban = 70%
- Access to skilled birth attendant in rural = 30%
- Neonatal deaths from asphyxia.....25%
- Serious neurological sequelae 25%


