

### Message from Professor Tashmin Khamis, Vice Provost Quality, Teaching and Learning

pandemic. AKU mirrors this experience: the Network of Quality, Teaching and Learning (QTL\_net) responded to the need for 'quaranteaching' during the rapid transition to online course offering and subsequently to supporting faculty with designing and encouraging good practice for <u>online course delivery</u>. The dedicated and seemingly tireless QTL\_net team engaged over 3000 participants, mostly faculty, who attended bespoke professional development sessions through the digital boot-camps, Ed tech lounges, online course design and instructional skills online workshops. With the Provost's oversight, AKU is pioneering its Digital Learning Strategy - thank you to all those who have taken part in shaping the way forward in reimagining learning centred teaching in a COVID world. This is the theme of our exciting and innovative Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) UnConference – the first of its kind at AKU to be held on <u>29th and 30th of November 2021</u>.

QTL\_net's capabilities in quality enhancement, digital learning and professionalising teaching at the whole institution level is being recognised regionally and internationally. You will find details throughout this newsletter. The Network is increasingly impacting our institutional teaching culture as AKU continues to reward and recognise teaching excellence through the <u>TEACH Fellowships</u> that is an internationally recognised higher education teaching qualification. Teaching Dossiers that are now a requisite component for academic promotions with over 30 faculty who have participated; recognition of teaching excellence through the <u>AKU Teachers Academy</u>; and now the first Award for Collaborative Practice in <u>SOTL (ACPSOTL).</u>

Such an institutional culture change needs the buy-in of all our faculty and today QTL\_net has reached 91% of our faculty globally with 75% repeat participants in our various programmes, however, sustained institutional change and impacting our evolution to

academic excellence requires support from the very top of the university. We, therefore, proudly and humbly acknowledge the unmitigated support and leadership of <u>President Firoz</u> <u>Rasul</u> and the whole senior leadership team as well as members of the Board of Trustees for their continued championing of QTL\_net's activities. It was under President Rasul's tenure and active participation of both him and Professor Saida Rasul in the inaugural event that AKU became the first Advance HE accredited institution in the developing world. This has enabled us to benchmark the quality of our teaching in higher education globally through the Higher Education Academy and its fellowship scheme. The principles set by our President of "Uncompromising Quality" to serving the Academy with "High Expectations" will continue to guide the work of QTL\_net.

### Academic Teaching Excellence Awards at the Convocation: How QTL\_net is Impacting a Cultural Change at AKU (1 min read)



During the recent AKU virtual convocation 2021, the faculty awards to recognize teaching effectiveness and teaching excellence were granted for the first time at the graduation ceremony. 28 faculty members from SONAM, IED and Medical College Pakistan and East Africa were awarded certificates for gaining their Higher Education Academy (UK) Fellowship in 2020-21 through QTL\_net's TEACH scheme. 14 faculty members who represent the inaugural members of AKU Teachers' Academy were also recognized at the convocation ceremony, signaling the increasing significance of rewarding and recognizing teaching at AKU.



QTL\_net and the Rapid Online and Remote Teaching Coordinating Group (RORTCG) are supporting the development of an Aga Khan University wide Digital Learning Strategy to address any gaps and issues, while maintaining the benefits and successes from last year's experiences of online teaching and learning. In order to ensure that all stakeholders were heard, 21 Focus group discussions were held with faculty members, support staff from academic entities, staff from supporting entities and students from Pakistan, East Africa and the UK. Currently, we are also interviewing senior leadership members. Once the data is collected we will

be analysing it to create a comprehensive digital learning strategy.

### Dr. Jane Rarieya, Appointed to Advance HE's Expert Advisory Group (1 min read)



In the 2nd Quarter of 2021, QTL\_net in collaboration with Aga Khan University's entities conducted two important exercises to meet the Higher Education Commission (HEC) compliance requirements in Pakistan. Primarily, this exercise involves the review of progress and actions taken in preparation for the improvement areas identified by the Institutional Performance Evaluation (IPE) in response to Higher Education Commission (HEC) requirements in Pakistan. Despite the pandemic, respective programmes and support units made definite progress since July 2019 to 2021. Secondly, AKU for the first time conducted the self-graduate programme review in addition to AKU's Quality Assurance reviews of programmes that follow the <u>AKU Quality Assurance Framework</u> (policy 030).

## QTL\_net presents at the INQAAHE Conference 2021: 'Rethinking Quality through Online Learning: An Opportunity within a Crisis' (1 min read)

To many

in academia, the novel COVID-19 virus has presented an unprecedented crisis, an obstacle to the conventional didactic mode of teaching. However, higher education institutions now have the catalytic opportunity, with regular self and peer assessment of their programmes, to

engage in more blended and online learning and to develop more effective and responsive learning opportunities by using information technology.

### Dr Pammla Petrucka's Session in the QTL\_net Teaching and Learning Series: Becoming a 'SUPER'visor (1 min read)



To support AKU faculty develop a shared understanding of good supervision practices and address some of the key challenges they experience as supervisors, QTL\_net hosted a webinar on 'Becoming a SUPERvisor' on May 26, 2021. The webinar unpacked some of the best practices in graduate supervision that could encourage and promote an enriched and collegial work environment to pursue knowledge and academic inquiry. The session was facilitated by Professor Pammla Petrucka, who is currently serving at the University of Saskatchewan and is visiting faculty at AKU's School of Nursing and Midwifery, Pakistan. Having supervised or co-

supervised more than 50 graduate students in four continents, Dr Petrucka shared her 'global' lens on graduate supervision. The webinar was attended by 93 faculty members drawn from all AKU campuses. The development of the Graduate Supervision Manual is currently underway. The manual will serve as a guide and resource for graduate students, faculty members, supervisors, and administrative staff who are involved in graduate education.


### The Future of Assessments (1 min read)



Given the emerging but urgent need to rethink assessments in higher education, especially during the pandemic, QTL\_net organized a Teaching and Learning webinar on the Future of Assessment for AKU faculty on Tuesday, July 27, 2021. The webinar aimed to unpack the future of assessment and discuss some of the best practices to make assessment smarter, fair and more effective as well as

address the common challenges around assessing students' learning. 64 faculty members and academic support staff participated in the webinar across AKU Pakistan, East Africa, and the UK.

### **Reflection of RTT Workshop (2 min read)**



QTL\_net offered the seventh Rethinking Teaching (RTT) workshop from June 21 to July 2, 2021, with the aim to encourage faculty to (re)design their courses so as to provide deep and meaningful learning experiences to students. 20 faculty members and academic support staff from different disciplines participated in the synchronous, asynchronous, and independent learning activities spread over six days. <u>Read More</u>

#### **TEACH Workshop** (1 min read)



QTL\_net offered a two-half-day TEACH Writing Workshop to 28 faculty members and staff involved in faculty development on June 3 and 8, 2021. This was the highest number of participants since QTL\_net started this scheme in May 2018. The workshop enables the participants to apply for an appropriate category for HEA Fellowship and gains recognition for teaching effectiveness through benchmarking their
