### **Aga Khan University**

### 2023 Student Experience Report, Nairobi Campus

This report covers the Student experience activities for the period March 2022 – March 2023.

#### 1. Registrar Kenya, Manager Student Experience and the Sports Associate

The Registrar's Office in Kenya was restructured to meet the requirements of the Commission for University Education in Kenya and as such the Manager- Student Experience joined the team in September 2022, the Registrar Kenya in October 2022 and in addition the Sports Associate reported in February 2023

## 2. Student Experience / Group Counselling Sessions

The Student Experience / Group counselling sessions were included in the orientation timetable for all new students joining AKU Kenya programmes in 2022/2023. The session involved interaction between the Manager Student Experience and the counsellor. The Manager Student Experience informed the students of the services and support available to them while the counsellor informed them of the availability of counselling services during their study period at AKU as well as a talk on work life balance as they commenced their studies. Counselling services were provided by AKU Counselling office led by Dr Merali.

The students were also welcomed with a cake which they celebrated with their Faculty-courtesy of the registrar's office.

#### 3. Election and Nomination of Student Leaders

#### 6. AKUSA LEADERSHIP TRAINING

A leadership training for students' leaders for Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and Pakistan was held on 15<sup>th</sup> December 2022 and a second session ran on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2023. The training was coordinated by the Manager Student Experience Kenya and facilitated by GSMC Kenya. There are two sessions pending to be conducted in 2023.

## 7. SPORTS DAY – GYM, SWIMMING SAVES LIFE INITIATIVE & BLOOD DRIVE

The swimming saves life initiative was actualized last year. Interested students were offered 12 free swimming lessons at the Aga Khan Sports Club. The office of the Student Experience also gave the students an opportunity to join the Health Club at a fee of Kshs 1000 while it met the rest of the costs.

As we prepared for the 2023 sports day, the Safety and occupational Health Department organised a one week health week where all students and staff were encouraged to check on their health. The AKUSA joined the team and rallied the students and staff to also donate blood to the AKUHN. About 5 people responded to the AKUSA call for blood donation. 2023 Sports Day was a partnership between AKU and AKUHN. The sports day was held on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> March 2023 and it was a great success.

## 8. STUDENT HOUSING,

The University has acquired three housing properties namely, Mtama Road Apartments, Limuru Court Apartments and Royal Court Apartments. The properties will accommodate the UGNE/UGME students, GSMC students and the Residents. Mtama Road and Limuru courts are in the process of renovation, while Royal Apartments are ready for occupation. The properties will be managed by the office of the registrar in collaboration with the facilities management. The preparations are being accelerated for students joining AKU, Kenya in September 2023.



## 9. Corporate Social Responsibility: CSR

In 2022, the Interim Vice Provost Dr Laila met with the AKUSA and had a discussion on what their roles are and what opportunities were there for them as the leaders and for the students. In the discussions, the AKUSA said there was need for a CSR activity and especially to Muranga County where the Nurses and Doctors go for their study. It was agreed that this was a great idea and also because the Muranga County has an MOU with AKU.

The discussions are ongoing and the CSR will run in 2023.
