Breast cancer is the fastest growing cancer in women worldwide. With early detection and treatment, breast cancer patients have a survival rate of more than 95%. Unfortunately, in Pakistan, which has one of the highest rates of breast cancer in Asia, most cases are diagnosed in later stages.

The Aga Khan University Hospital, Karachi (AKUH) is working to change this.

At AKUH, patients receive comprehensive breast cancer care, from screening and diagnosis to treatment and beyond. AKUH is a tertiary care facility and has expertise with complex and critical cases.

Patients are cared for by experienced physicians, surgeons and nurses using advanced equipment and facilities, all in one place.

"Many people think that AKUH is inaccessible to the masses. This is simply not true. We have patients coming from the remotest of areas of Pakistan, many of whom do not have the ability to pay for their treatment. Our welfare department is robust, and we assist all those who have a financial need."
